Memo of the meeting

After welcoming all the participants to the meeting, Mika told about the program and the structure for the meeting.

The workshop was divided into two sections. The first section concentrated on the supporting of engagement and participation. The topic was handled in each participating institution before the workshop by different means and a presentation was made from the results. These presentations that can be found in Moodle platform were a base for the work in Espoo. The participants were divided into three groups each focusing on the same topic (Supporting the engagement and participation) but from a different point of view. One group handled the topic from students' perspective, while the second group considered what were teachers' aspects on the topic. The third group's point of view was that of institute's. The work of the workgroups was very fruitful. Each of the three groups presented their work as a mind map and a short written description to the whole consortium. These descriptions will be placed in the handbook.

The second part of the workshop was a pedagogical seminar held for both the project participants and the entire staff of Omnia Adult Education Centre. The presenters in this seminar were Ms Katri Aaltonen from HAMK University of Applied Sciences and Ms Mervi Jansson from Omnia. Mika also presented briefly the project and the partners introduced themselves.

Ms Aaltonen talked about optimal learning environments and Ms Jansson about social media and the adult learner. Both presentations can be found in Moodle platform.

We also had discussions about the handbook: how it should look like, what it should contain and who will put it together. These ideas were formed into a list of guidelines. This list can also be found in Moodle.

Beside the work related workshops we also had some social activities in Espoo. These activities involved some students and staff of Omnia Adult Education Centre.

On the first evening we went to Nuuksio National Park where two students from the Tourism section had prepared some activities. The traditional Finnish game "Mölkky" was a big success. The students also prepared some food by the campfire.

On the second day one student from the Tourism section took the consortium sightseeing in Helsinki city centre showing some of the major attractions. The second evening was spent in the school building where Mika had arranged a special activity for the whole group. Everyone got an 'UVAL' apron and instructions on how to give their contribution to the farewell dinner. Some cookery students of the Adult Education Centre together with their teacher Bruno Stalder directed the project group in the kitchen and in no time at all we were having a wonderful dinner.
