- Order given by the National Board of Education in 2006
- The three steps of acquiring a qualification are to be individualized/personalized:
 - Applying
 - Planning and taking the competence test
 - Acquiring the necessary competence
- Individual study plan / Personalized study plan
 - Accreditation of prior learning
 - On-the-job-learning
 - Timetable for the whole qualification

- The type of motivation depends on the students current situation
- The type of motivation may change during the studies depending on the students own activity and the different possibilities that the institute offers





External motives (instrumental, focusing on the benefits of studying, practical)

- Open course possibilities
- IT-learning environments
- International activities
- Guidance services (guidance counsellor, special needs teacher)
- Tutor teachers / group supervisors
- The same teacher for a longer period in the beginning of the studies helps the students by answering numerous questions and giving consultance
- Flexible studying and learning possibilities
- Flexible applying obligatory enrolment
- Cooperation with the professional field



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Internal motives (related to mental and personal development and being interested in the meaning of studies)

- On-the-job-learning
- Project learning
- Flexible studying and learning possibilities
- Pride in profession
- International activities
- Open course possibilities
- Open doors activities
- Entrepreneur day activities





Social motives (related to being part of a group, meeting others and other means of interaction and satisfaction)

- Case study groups
